Council Summary:

- Reviewed task force revisions of <u>Articles of Incorporation</u>, <u>Bylaws and Standing Rules</u>, discussed several points, and approved for first reading at Assembly next month. Draft documents will be available on www.ourpresbytery.org in a week or so for your review.
- Approved Rev. Tom Smith, pastor of Presbyterian Chapel of the Lakes, Angola, to serve communion on October 7th at the annual <u>Wee Kirk</u> <u>Conference</u> in Angola, October 5-7, 2010.
- Heard enthusiastic reports from participants in the <u>Generosity Pilot Project</u> stewardship meetings and the value of the self-insight processes taught by Rev. Bill Enright of the Lake Institute on Faith & Giving.
- Received report from <u>General Presbyter Search team</u> concerning its recommended candidate from among the five strong candidates they brought in for face-to-face interviews. Following an interview with COM on September 2nd as a potential incoming minister member of Presbytery, the candidate will be announced to Presbytery and introduced to the Assembly in September.
- Considered analysis of restricted and unrestricted funds prepared by Financial Consultant Eric Herzog, and the monthly financial reports through July.
- Approved recommendation from AMT that some small real estate transactions proceed.
- Approved <u>Presbytery Operating Budget and Basic Mission Budget for 2011</u> for first reading at the September Assembly.
- Affirmed current position description for Stated Clerk.
- Revised the meeting calendar for 2011. Note particularly <u>next year's</u>
 <u>September Assembly</u> overnight retreat at Geneva Center moved to September 16-17, 2011. Website calendar has been updated.
- Discussed principles for <u>prioritizing use of Geneva Center</u>, considering its dual commitments as venue for the Presbytery and its work, and as a conference center intended to be financially self-supporting through increased usage of meals and overnight hospitality services. Conversations will continue.
- Approved numerous recommendations of Committee on Ministry from its meeting August 5th that lacked a quorum.

Our <u>Assembly Retreat September 17-18 at Geneva Center</u> has a full docket. Besides anticipating our guest speaker, Rev. Paul Hooker from the Presbytery of St. Augustine, who will lead sessions on the Form of Government (nFOG) proposed by the 219th General Assembly, we will meet our General Presbyter candidate, conduct some key elections, review budgets and our own revisions to our governing documents, and examine Jody Noble for ordination to a call to Immanuel-Schererville. Registration for minister members and elder commissioners will begin September 1.
